Rendezvous

Each summer, Colorado's trappers (mountain men) and Native Americans gathered at an agreed upon place for a rendezvous. There they met with traders who brought salt, sugar, blankets, tobacco, beads and guns and traded these for beaver furs and buffalo hides. After doing business, the rendezvous often became a month-long social event with singing, dancing, shouting, and frolicking.

In the spirit of a rendezvous, the fourth graders will have a celebration in the morning wherein they, like the trappers and traders, can trade with each other. Students can bring anything from home they would like to trade. This should be something of little value that they are ready part with. ***Please do not purchase anything.*** Trade items should be limited to one or two per child.
